Requirements resulting from licensing inspection:

- **1**. HSCR 44A(2), LTCPR 6.2.15
 - Additional Requirements for Nursing Homes The licensee shall ensure an interdisciplinary pharmacy committee, consisting of at least the Administrator of the Home, Medical Advisor, Pharmacist, Director of Resident Care and Clinical Dietitian, meets a minimum of every six months. The pharmacy committee shall meet regularly to establish and monitor guidelines consistent with these regulations in relation to the storage, administration and control of drugs in the home.
- **2**. LTCPR 8.4.12

The licensee shall ensure staff influenza immunization rates, in homes with greater than 5 employees, are posted in a public place and updated a minimum of twice per year on December 15th and on March 1st.

3. LTCPR 6.3.7

The licensee shall ensure each resident has an opportunity to complete or provide a personal directive which includes identifying a substitute decision maker. If completed, the personal directive will be placed on the resident record. Otherwise, it is documented on the record that a personal directive was discussed with the resident.

4. LTCPR 11.1.6

The licensee shall ensure the home provides a documented, timely orientation for all staff members, volunteers and contracted personnel. The orientation provides the necessary information to support residents in a safe manner and improve their quality of life.

5. LTCPR 12.1.3

The licensee shall ensure regularly scheduled environmental services audits are completed to ensure compliance with leading practices for environmental cleaning.

6. LTCPR 12.2.2.a

The licensee shall ensure aesthetic, functional and surface integrity of the following are maintained: hard surfaced areas such as, but not limited to, smooth, level walkways.

7. HSCR 38(5)(b)

The administrator of a home for special care licensed by the Minister of Health and Wellness may authorize a resident to store drugs locked in the resident's room if the requirements set out in policy and standards for the home are met.

8. LTCPR 8.3.6

The licensee shall ensure all persons who are employed by the licensee, or who are providing services on behalf of the licensee, are provided with education regarding the licensee's policies and procedures related to abuse and the PPCA.

9. LTCPR 6.2.16

The licensee shall ensure a stand-alone wound care committee is implemented, or wound care issues/practices are included as a standing agenda item on another appropriate committee (i.e. Quality Committee). The committee shall be interdisciplinary ensuring that wound prevention and management is regularly reviewed and revised to reflect leading practices and provincial direction and identify trends for quality improvement.
