Requirements resulting from licensing inspection:

1. LTCPR 12.1.8
The licensee shall ensure cleaning and disinfectant products and other chemicals used in environmental cleaning are not used after their expiration date.
2. HSCR 18(3)
In every nursing home and nursing care section of a home for the aged where there are thirty or more residents, there shall be at least one registered nurse on duty at all times.
3. HSCR 20B, LTCPR 7.4.3
The licensee shall ensure management and staff meetings are held a minimum of quarterly.
4. HSCR 27(8), LTCPR 9.2.4.d, LTCPR 9.2.4.e
The licensee shall ensure fire protection equipment is maintained in good working order. Fire alarms and fire doors are tested monthly; fire extinguishers are inspected monthly and tested annually in accordance with the Office of the Fire Marshal. Records of testing and inspections of fire protection equipment and systems are maintained.
5. LTCPR 12.1.4 c
The licensee shall ensure the following processes are developed and followed: ensuring compliance with Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS) regulations. Current Material Safety Data Sheets for all applicable products used/stored in the home are maintained and are easily accessible to staff members.
6. LTCPR 11.3.4
The licensee shall ensure maintenance of annual attendance records for individual staff participation in education sessions, including the date of the sessions.

- 7.** LTCPR 12.1.3
The licensee shall ensure regularly scheduled environmental services audits are completed to ensure compliance with leading practices for environmental cleaning.
- 8.** LTCPR 8.4.3
The licensee shall ensure a stand-alone Infection Prevention and Control Committee is implemented or infection prevention and control issues/practices are included as a standing agenda item on another appropriate committee. The committee shall be multidisciplinary ensuring that the infection prevention and control program is regularly reviewed and revised to reflect leading practices and provincial direction.
