The licensee shall ensure the following processes are developed and followed: ensuring compliance with Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS) regulations. Current Material Safety Data Sheets for all applicable products used/stored in the home are maintained and are easily accessible to staff members.
3. LTCPR 6.5.2.d  
The licensee shall ensure the following processes are developed and followed: tracking and monitoring intake of meals, supplements and fluids as required.
4. HSCR 34(1)(b), LTCPR 7.5.1.c  
The licensee shall ensure compliance with all applicable government inspection processes, policies, standards, requirements and service agreements, including but not limited to, the following authorities: Nova Scotia Environment.
5. LTCPR 6.5.2.c  
The licensee shall ensure the following processes are developed and followed: labeling of food in refrigerators and discarding of expired food.
6. LTCPR 6.2.16  
The licensee shall ensure a stand-alone wound care committee is implemented, or wound care issues/practices are included as a standing agenda item on another appropriate committee (i.e. Quality Committee). The committee shall be interdisciplinary ensuring that wound prevention and management is regularly reviewed and revised to reflect leading practices and provincial direction and identify trends for quality improvement.
